- 1 this is a graphic illustration of a country's demographics showing the distribution between genders and age cohorts (two words).
- 4 the ability of an area to support its population with available resources and technology (two words).
- 8 the largest concentration of population in India lives along the plains bordering this river.
- 9 LDCs entered stage two of the demographic transition because of the diffusion of _____ knowledge.
- 11 these types of diseases become more prevalent in stage three of the epidemiological transition because more people reach middle age.
- 14 the support system or skeleton of a society.
- 16 these people are especially concerned about where current population growth is focused and predict violent competition for resources besides food, like clean water and energy (hyph./plural).
- 17 before stage three, children are often viewed as this to their parents (two words, plural)
- 20 this process of increasing interactions is a concern during stage five of the epidemiological transition because it may mean that lethal pandemics can't be contained.
- 22 this is the number of deaths of infants under one per 1,000 live births during a year (three words).
- 25 this demographic measure is the most important in determining the shape of a population pyramid, it declines rapidly in stage three as children become seen as economic burdens (three words).
- 26 this region is home to nearly one-fourth of the world's population and includes the world's most populous country (two words).
- 29 this dilemma is faced by LDCs who experience rapid population growth resulting in resources being diverted from the economic development which are needed in order to develop economically and consequently bring the high crude birth rate down (two words).
- 31 the decline in this demographic measure is the most dramatic change as countries enter Stage 2 of the Demographic Transition (three words).
- 32 this is the forced sterilization of a targeted population.
- 33 this rate is calculated as the average number of births a woman will have throughout her childbearing years (three words).
- 38 nearly 1/6th of the world's population can be described as this with most of them being women and children.
- 39 description of land suitable for farming
- 40 this stands at around 1.2% globally after peaking in the 1960s at over 2.2%. At this pace the global population will double in 50 – 60 years (book says 54, I disagree) (three words).
- 42 a disease that is global in scope
- 45 the availability of these and their use by women in developed countries has resulted in decreasing the crude birth rate in later stage economies (plural).
- 46 this is directly related to birth rates reaching all-time lows in stages four and five as an important segment of society seeks educational and economic opportunities outside the home (two words).
- 47 the amount of years it would take for a population to increase by 100% given a constant rate of natural increase (two words).
- 50 this group claims that Malthus is wrong not because there aren't enough resources but that they are not distributed fairly (plural).
- 51 an age-group of people as represented by a bar on population pyramid.
- 52 although the death rate declines significantly due to increased access to medicine and a more certain food supply during stage two, diseases connected to overcrowding appear (like cholera) due to industrialization and this other rapid change in how people live.
- 53 this synonym for widespread disease is one of the main causes in epidemiological transition for stage one.
- 54 also known as pro-natalist, these are government policies that promote reproduction and bigger families.
- 55 this is the comparison of the number of people who are too old and too young to work compared to the number of those of working age (two words).
- 56 she criticized Malthusian theory for not taking into account the increased agricultural production that could result from population increases (last name).
- 57 countries reach this point in stage four when crude birth rate decreases to equal crude death rate (three words).
- 58 if this density measure is too high there may be too much stress on the resources of an area.

- 3 if this density is high it implies that your country has inefficient farming methods.
- 5 the West African population cluster is centered around this country which is Africa's most populous.
- 6 most of the world's population growth is happening in these countries (two words)
- 7 this was the most common cause of death throughout most of human history due to unreliable food sources.
- 10 because of an increasingly elderly population, this disease becomes a representative cause of death in stage four, "The Age of Delayed Degenerative Disease"
- 12 this region is heavily urbanized and its population has historically clustered in industrial regions with access to coal supplies.
- 13 the relationship between IMR and either CBR, CDR or TFR can be described as this.
- 15 this region is home to nearly one-fourth of the world's population and includes the three of the world's top ten most populous countries (two words).
- 18 the middle part of this century saw the most rapid increase in global population mainly due to the diffusion of medical knowledge to LDCs and their consequent entry into stage two of the demographic transition.
- 19 he urged moral restraint in order to get population growth under control or believed that the world would face drastic corrective increases in the death rate (last name)
- 21 this region is unusual in that it has significant population clusters in mountainous areas (two words).
- 23 this is a 2.1 total fertility rate which eventually results in stable population growth (not increase or decline) (two words).
- 24 also known as anti-natalist, these government policies (like China's one-child policy) discourage reproduction and try to reduce population growth rates.
- 27 although some countries have recently reached or come close to the replacement rate, their population continues to grow because of the large number of people in their child-bearing years. This phenomenon is known as _____ (two words).
- 28 this historical change led to decreased death rates and, consequently, population increases in MDCs about 200 years ago (two words).
- 30 this is the predictable process of change common to most countries' population statistics as their economies mature (two words).
- 34 this transition mirrors the stages of the demographic transition but tries to explain the main diseases and causes of death in the various stages.
- 35 group of countries which entered stage two of the demographic transition as they industrialized and are now mostly in either stage four or theoretical stage five.
- 36 this density measures the total number of objects within an area.
- 37 this problem includes the relationship between the number of people and the available resources in an area.
- 41 he criticized Malthusian theory for not understanding that population growth is the solution to resource scarcities and environmental problems, since people and markets innovate (full name).
- 43 these types of diseases (like malaria) require a vector (person, animal or microorganism) to be passed along to new victims.
- 44 this part of China is the most sparsely inhabited with most of the Chinese population clustered along the east coast and along river valleys and basins.
- 48 the population cluster in the eastern United States has created this type of continuous urban area formed when metropolitan areas surrounding cities start to merge.
- 49 the portion of the earth's surface occupied by permanent human settlement.
